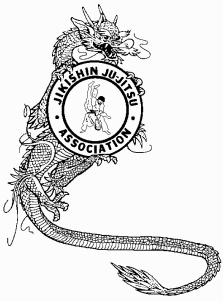

Extract From JJJA Rules – 2003 Edition

- 3.1. There is no individual membership of Jikishin. Any person wishing to join must do so through an existing Jikishin club.
- 3.2.1 On commencement of training at a selected Jikishin Club, the new student must fill in the correct application form for membership. The Sensei will retain this for no more than two weeks and by this time the student will be expected to pay the current annual membership fee. This fee and the fully completed form must immediately be sent to the Association Secretary for registration. Jikishin will not be responsible should this not be adhered to.
- 3.4.1. On failure to renew annual membership, students and sensei's alike put themselves outside of the BJJAGB and UNJJ.
- 4.1 It is the responsibility of the student to ensure memberships are renewed annually. This must be done by a fully completed membership application form for renewal, plus the current renewal fee and licence being sent to the Association Secretary prior to the renewal date. If dues are not received by the renewal date, then the current full annual fee becomes due, plus the current BJJAGB monthly fine. Disciplinary action will be taken against any persons who abuse the renewal procedure. Subsequent to such Disciplinary Action, no further penalties will be imposed.
- 5.1. On having joined the club of their choice, the Sensei of that Club is responsible for monitoring the progress of the student and will be the only person to put forward the student for any gradings or events. The student is expected to train at their chosen Club on a regular basis and is to be actively encouraged to participate in Jikishin, BJJAGB and UNJJ events.
- 6.1. Providing the student has trained regularly at the Club at which they are registered, the student will qualify for the right to train at any Jikishin or BJJAGB Club they choose. However, out of courtesy, they must inform their Club Sensei that they are doing so at the outset of any such training visits.
- 6.2. A student may only train at clubs registered with the BJJAGB and should ask to see the Dojo Registration before training.
- 6.3.1. No student may train outside of the U.K. without informing the BJJAGB Overseas Chairman of the intent to do so in order to obtain permission to do so.
- 7.1. If, for any reason, a student wishes to change Club, they must first approach their Club Sensei for assistance with this matter. The Club Sensei must help the student with the change if their reasons for such a change are valid, however no student will be permitted to change on a whim.
- 7.2. If no amicable change can be agreed, both the student and Club Sensei must approach the Head of the Association for help. In the unlikely event of no amicable solution being reached, the student must leave the Club for six months, after which period the student may re-apply to join any Jikishin Club.
- 7.3.1. All Sensei's must endeavor not to allow clashes of personality to cloud their judgment on matters of changing club.

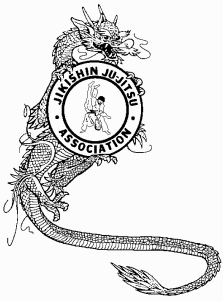
- 8.1. All senior students must grade at the Official Association Grading Days. Only with prior permission or in exceptional circumstances will this be allowed to alter.
- 8.2. All applications to Grade must be received by Head Office two weeks prior to the Grading Date. Each Club Sensei is required to submit a list of those students eligible to take the grading on the appropriate form confirming the student fit to grade, along with an up to date licence, plus the current grading fee.
- 8.3. A student who has not trained on a regular basis for the appropriate minimum grading period may not be submitted for grading.
- 8.4. MINIMUM GRADING PERIODS FOR SENIORS

Novice to White 3months	Green to Blue	3months
White to Yellow 3months	Blue to Purple	3months
Yellow to Green 6months	Purple to Brown	6months

This is deemed to be a minimum of 12 training sessions for a 3 month training period and 24 training sessions for a 6month training period.

- 10.1. A purple belt and above, students must attend Ko-Budo Courses, and should practise Ko-Budo at class level in order to maintain the standards required for assessment. Ko-Budo Grade Levels are required for the Black Belt Grades as follows.

Level 5	1 st Dan
Level 4	2 nd Dan
Level 3	3 rd Dan
Level 2	4 th Dan
- 10.2. A minimum of three Ko-Budo courses must be attended before taking the Level 5 exam. This does not apply to further levels, which all require more attendance's to achieve the required standard.
- 10.3. Level one requires that a Level 2 student has been regularly teaching on Ko-Budo Courses and have a total understanding of all the Ko-Budo sections.
- 13.1. All student enquiries' must be dealt with by the Club Sensei. No student should approach the Head of the Association or Head Office direct without the permission of the Club Sensei except in the case of an emergency.
- 14.2. When visiting a country for organised UNJJ meetings, a package will be organised by Head Office and only these arrangements will be allowed. No alternative or private means of attending overseas courses is permitted. No member of Jikishin should approach another Group overseas, within or outside of the UNJJ, without the knowledge and permission of Head Office.
- 16.1. If a new student already has a Gi on commencement of training in a Jikishin club, they may be allowed to wear it providing it is (a) White-both Jacket & Pants (b) Devoid of all other Association Badges/Emblems. (c) Clean and pressed with no rips or tears.
- 16.2. Only students wearing the official Association Gi complete with the appropriate BJJAGB Badges will be allowed to grade.

- 17.1.1. It is the official policy of the BJJAGB to expect members to wear a Governing Body badge on training uniforms.
- 17.2. Prior to taking the Brown Belt exam, the examiners will only consider the candidate fully supportive if the candidate is wearing one badge of each of the organisations. (Jikishin/BJJAGB/UNJJ).
- 17.3. The suggested areas for badges are left breast – Jikishin Assoc. Badge. Right Arm – Authorised Club Badge. Left Arm – UNJJ Badge. Right Breast – BJJAGB Shield. No badge of any other group/association may be worn without the express permission of Head Office.
- 19.1. The official uniform for travel when representing Jikishin is an approved Association Black Polo Shirt, black jogging type bottoms, training type shoes and the official Jikishin Black Bomber Jacket.
- 20.1. Any member who fails to renew membership in good time is automatically disbarred from the BJJAGB. After 3months the member's record is deleted from the records of the Association and the BJJAGB. All grades and instructor qualifications are no longer valid and should the member wish to return, it may be necessary to re-qualify.
- 22.2. If a student is unhappy with any aspect within Ju-Jitsu, they should approach their Club Sensei in an endeavour to resolve the problem (preliminary stage).
- 22.3. If the student is still unsatisfied they may then approach the Head of the Association for the complaint to be heard by him, with their Club Sensei present. (stage one).
- 22.4. If no satisfactory conclusion is reached, the student must then apply in writing to the Chairman of the BJJAGB requesting to be heard by the Complaints/Disciplinary Panel (stage two).
- 25.1.1. Any club sensei visited by a student not registered with their own club, should verify that the student has informed their own club sensei of their visit. Any Sensei approaching a student with the intent to poach them to their own club will be subject to disciplinary action and punishment. Only training at the club where they are registered counts towards gradings, unless by arrangement with the students club sensei.
- 28.2. Courses will be a part of the grading structure. Students who do not attend a minimum of one course per year (not including ko-budo) will not be considered for gradings to and within the Dan Gradings.
